
SIGHT AND SOUND UPDATE

QUEENSGATE THEATRE FREMANTLE CLOSURE - PROJECTORS

By the time you receive this newsletter the Queensgate Cinema in Fremantle will have closed its doors. The 1980s era complex of office block and movie house is set to bite the dust in favour of a six-storey hotel, office and shopping block. Hoyts allowed Graeme Lacey and Roy Mudge to remove 3 projectors which are now stored at Sunset Hospital.

EARLY TV



Member Richard Rennie has donated the first TV imported into Western Australia to AMMPT. The set (a 17 inch Kreisler model) was originally owned by Arthur Pidgeon who was the Kreisler distributor in WA for many years. It was imported in 1957, two years before transmission began in this state. The set is in working condition and was used by Richard in the Fremantle Light and Sound Discovery Centre at the former Fremantle History Museum.

SUNSET WORK CONTINUES

Up to ten members at a time have been attending Sunset Hospital work sessions. As a consequence more efficient storage for memorabilia and equipment has been generated. The display areas for TV and been commenced. cinema have recognition that much of the equipment is extremely heavy the committee approved the purchase of a small indoor crane and air compressor to complement the existing hand trolley and piano dolly. The air compressor is to be used to remove dust from inaccessible equipment areas. New doors have also been fitted to the licensed area to ensure even greater security.
