AMMPT - DEDUCTABLE GIFT RECIPIENT (DGR) STATUS


Following contact and discussions with the Australian Tax Office (ATO), AMMPT Western Region Secretary Peter Foyster has completed and lodged an application for DGR status. Once approved people or organisations may donate to AMMPT and claim a tax deduction. The initiative is part of long-term planning by the committee to ensure AMMPT's financial stability. It was also one reason for the constitution changes approved at the 2017 AGM.

CINEMECCANICA PROJECTOR DONATION

Member John Woodall has donated a Cinemeccanica Victoria X 35-70mm projector to our museum. The projector was one of two installed in 1960 in the Chelsea Cinema in Melbourne formerly the Majestic Theatre opening with a 70mm screening of Porgy and Bess. Greater Union moved the projector in 1974 along Flinders Street to the Forum Theatre (originally the State Theatre). Eventually the projectors were shipped to the Carlton Cinema in Hamilton New Zealand. John who was living in Wellington at the time purchased them from Hoyts NZ and installed them in his house. On returning to Perth he used them for many years in his Atwell home cinema. Amongst his many work placements John was employed by MGM at the Metro Theatre in William Street Perth and by the Ace Theatre company at their drive-in theatres. Many thanks to John for his donation to an ever- growing collection of projectors at the Sunset Museum.
