

### CLASSICS OF THE SILVER SCREEN SEPTEMBER 17<sup>th</sup> – 10.00am GRAND CYGNET THEATRE PRESTON STREET, COMO.

The next Classics of the Silver Screen will be the 1953 Warner Brothers film version of Sigmund Romberg's operetta THE DESERT SONG. Film stars Kathryn Grayson and Gordon MacRae top the star-studded cast. The story is a version of plots such as The Scarlet Pimpernel, Zorro and later Superman, where a hero adopts a mild-mannered disguise to keep his true identity a secret whilst he also loves a beautiful and spirited girl. This is the third film made based on Romberg's operetta and the third made by Warner Brothers. It was released in 1953 but was not made in widescreen; at that time Twentieth-Century Fox held the rights to Cinemascope. The 1953 film box office was \$2 million (US).

# AMMPT DATA BASE

One of the expectations of a modern museum is that it will offer an online facility which allows for research and access to persons who are geographically distant from it. For many years Mosaic has been the software package proposed for use in cataloguing the AMMPT museum collection. Whilst a few database entries have been made there has been a resistance from potential users to use Mosaic. Committee member Harry Smith identified a free but simpler to use data base software package called Musarch. Extensive examination of Musarch by members including Trevor Kelly, Ken McKay, Peter Foyster, Harry Smith and Keith Rutherford who gave advice to the committee has resulted in the adoption of Musarch. Librarian Beth McKechnie has been quick to use the new data base.
